

# "... stop asking IF it's possible and start asking HOW ..."

A friend of mine saw *The Play That Goes Wrong* in NYC and immediately after texted me that this was a show Tipping Point needed to do. After reading the play, I knew she was right, but I kept thinking it wasn't possible. The size of the cast was too big, the set was too big, and the technical needs were way too big. But of all of the plays I had read in the last five years, none made me laugh more. So, in order to bring this production to the TPT stage, I needed to stop asking IF it was possible and start asking HOW we were going to make it happen.

TPT added a week of rehearsal, increased the budget, created a partnership with Wayne State University, and formed a design team that would embrace what Tipping Point is and find how *The Play that Goes Wrong* could go "wrong" here in Northville. Pulling all these pieces together is how we embraced our core value of Adaptability.

Even with all of these organizational gymnastics, mounting a production titled The Play That Goes Wrong in the current climate is tempting fate. Looking back at what has happened to the entertainment industry over the past two years, many would say nothing has gone right. But, that is not entirely true in Tipping Point's case, as we have received a record amount of grants and donations that created a safety net for TPT. Not only does this safety net make a play of this size possible for us, it also allows us to devise and implement a safety plan for our staff, artists, and patrons so we can continue creating theatre until we can operate at full capacity again. On top of the financial support, we have been able to take the time to build a stronger, more diverse theatre. A theatre that can truthfully hold "the mirror up to nature" and reflect the beautiful complexity of the world we live in. Yes, we have suffered through the stress of this pandemic, but that chunk of "wrong," helped make way for a whole lot of "right."

But there still remains a distinct possibility that this run could go wrong. Canceling performances due to the pandemic has already happened in theatres across the country from large houses on Broadway to small theatres in Michigan. We are grateful for the patience and understanding of our patrons as we continue to adapt together and move forward. Because it is now not a question of IF we move forward, but HOW.

In this world of "Wrong," there is always a way to move forward.



# Henry Lewis, Henry Shields, & Jonathan Sayer | Playwrights

Henry, Henry, and Jonathan met while training at The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA). All core members of Mischief Theatre, they had already worked in comedy together for several years before they started out as a writing team. The three's first piece was The Play That Goes Wrong (winner, Best New Comedy - Olivier Awards and What's On Stage Awards). The show started out on the London and Edinburgh fringe before touring the United Kingdom and internationally, then returning to the West End in September 2014, where it is still running. It's also playing on Broadway, went on a United States national tour in 2018, and has been performed in over 20 other countries around the world. Peter Pan Goes Wrong was the trio's second piece, opening in November 2014 for a UK tour before a hugely successful West End season in Christmas 2015. Henry, Henry, and Jonathan recently adapted the script of Peter Pan Goes Wrong for the BBC, which was filmed with the original West End cast and broadcast to rave reviews on New Year's Eve. They were invited back to wreak more havoc at the BBC in 2017 with Christmas Carol Goes Wrong on BBC1. # **Tipping Point Staff**

#### James R. Kuhl | Producing Artistic Director

James has been Tipping Point Theatre's Producing Artistic Director since 2009. He received his Bachelor of Arts in Theatre from Alma College and his Master of Fine Arts in Acting from Wayne State University. He completed The Purple Rose Theatre Apprentice Program, as well as a two-year internship with Alma College, where he helped teach classes. James learned set carpentry while working at Interlochen Fine Arts Camp and is a past winner of the Heck Rabi Playwriting Competition for The Kings of Unionville, which was later performed at Tipping Point as its first world premiere play. 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


