

"I hope I have captured their spirit and their steadfast love for one another."

I took my first tap lesson at three years old. My mother was the teacher. I thought everyone's mother was a tap dancer. I grew up hearing about The Butler Sisters — my mother and two of my aunts — and their travels around Michigan as a tap act during the Depression. There were so many stories. Like when their costume trunk got lost

and they performed in their matching pajamas, which the audience thought was adorable. Or the time a mouse ran onstage in the middle of their act and practically started a stampede. But my favorite story was about the time they auditioned for the famous Major Bowe's talent show and met Betty Hutton. I had no idea who Betty Hutton was; just that she became a movie star, and that was good enough for me. I loved looking through the scrapbooks filled with Butler Sisters publicity photos and newspaper clippings. I was impressed and amazed that my mom and my aunts were so "famous."

But their relationships with each other went much further than tap dancing. Even after the act fell apart and their teaching academy fell apart and one or two marriages fell apart, they were there for one another and throughout their lives they remained very close. That's not to say they always got along. In fact, they didn't get along more than they did. They took turns being mad at one another. They bickered and criticized and badmouthed and brought each other to tears. But mostly, they laughed together. They really loved to laugh.

The Baxter Sisters is not the true story of the Butler Sisters. It is inspired by them and some of the incidents that occur in the play really happened; the rest is purely from my imagination. But I hope I have captured their spirit and their steadfast love for one another. The play is my tribute to them and to all tap dancers — and sisters — everywhere.




Anne Damman | May
