

"The importance of this work to us is the idea of transformative change."

Let me be honest - I like Scrooge. I don't mean the changed Scrooge. I am talking top-of-the-play, cheap, grumpy, workaholic Scrooge. The Scrooge that isn't comfortable with touching or hugging. The Scrooge that dislikes Christmas and Christmas time. I have often been called Scrooge at production meetings when it comes to the budget and finances, so there is something endearing to me about a cantankerous grumpy old man just trying to save a dollar. I do draw a line with the blatant exploitation of those that do not have the same power

and resources as he does. That part of Scrooge is incredibly unattractive. But there is something about his core that I resonate with. So, I like Scrooge ... but I don't like watching the same old A Christmas Carol. It's like nutmeg in your sugar cookies; just a flavor is enough.

This is why I thoroughly enjoyed Patrick Barlow's adaptation of A Christmas Carol and decided to crack open this dusty old chestnut roasting on an open fire. It didn't try to be what everyone else knows and does. He takes more obscure moments in the original tale, leans on our imaginations, and has given the framework for a world that combines Tim Burton, The Wizard of Oz, and a Winter Wonderland. And that is what our artists have set out to create for you.

The importance of this work to us is the idea of transformative change. It matters less to be historically accurate, and more to highlight the universal truth of Scrooge's journey. That journey is not one of a greedy rich man learning to give to those with less. It is a journey of HEALING from deep trauma. That when we deal with the trauma of our past, we can be more giving in our present, so that we always have hope for a better future. A sentiment that is very applicable to changes happening in our world today.

Like directing *The 39 Steps, A Christmas Carol* was a truly joyous experience. The process was filled with exploration and creative problem solving. It is theatrical storytelling and a fitting vehicle for my often absurd brand of humor. I hope it brings you some much needed Christmas Cheer.

On behalf of everyone here at Tipping Point, we wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy Holiday season. May you be blessed every day in the coming year.



Alexis Primus | Actor 1



Charles Dickens | Author

Charles Dickens (1812-1870) was a British novelist, journalist, editor, illustrator, and social commentator who wrote such beloved classic novels as *Oliver Twist, Nicholas Nickleby, David Copperfield, A Tale of Two Cities,* and *Great Expectations* in addition to *A Christmas Carol.* Dickens is remembered as one of the most important and influential writers of the 19th century. Among his accomplishments, he has been lauded for providing a stark portrait of the Victorianera underclass, helping to bring about social change.

Patrick Barlow | Adapter

Patrick's Olivier-nominated adaptation of A Christmas Carol has played off-Broadway and London's West End; while his four-person adaptation of The 39 Steps has played in over 40 countries, winning Olivier, Helpmann, Moliere, and Tony Awards, and making him the most performed playwright in America for 2012-13. Most recently, his rewriting of John Milton's Comus has played to critical acclaim at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre. Patrick is also celebrated in the UK for his two-man theatre company National Theatre of Brent, whose comedy epics include Wagner's Ring Cycle, The Charles and Diana Story, The Messiah, The Wonder of Sex, The Arts and How They Was Done, The Black Hole of Calcutta, The Life and Times of the Dalai Lama and Zulu! They have won two Sony Gold Awards, a Premier Ondas Award for Best European Comedy, and the New York Festival Gold Award for Best Comedy. Other screenwriting includes Van Gogh (Prix Futura Berlin Film Festival), Revolution!! (Best Comedy Jerusalem Film Festival) and the BAFTA-winning The Young Visiters. Publications include Shakespeare: The Truth! and The Complete History of the Whole World. Patrick has also appeared in Absolutely Fabulous, Shakespeare in Love, Notting Hill, Nanny McPhee, and Bridget Jones's Diary. He is currently writing theatre versions of The Hound of the Baskervilles and Dracula.


